Reasons:	

Warning: A fixed Penalty Notice may be issued by the Local Authority if you choose to take unauthorised term time leave of absence.

- The first time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be £160 per parent, per child when paid within 28 days reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.
- Second offence (within 3 years) The second time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be £160 per parent, per child when paid within 28 days (no option for lower fine amount).
- A third or further offences (within 3 years) Where a third offence is committed a penalty notice will not be issued. The case is likely to proceed to Magistrates' court. Magistrate's fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child.
